

Open Space Tips & Resources

The Approach:

Open Space (OS), a unique, non-proprietary conference methodology allows for participants to create on-demand, participant-led solutions in a collaborative setting. The method is built on the philosophy that people can self-manage. Open Space is an appropriate solution when the following five conditions exist:

- 1. There is an issue to address
- 2. The issue is complex
- 3. The participants are a diverse group of people (and many points of view exist)
- 4. The people involved are passionate about the issue
- 5. There is some urgency to address the issue.

Predictable Results:

- 1. Every issue of concern will be raised (assuming participants take responsibility to do so)
- 2. All issues will have received full discussion (to the extent desired)
- 3. A full report of issues/discussion will be created for all participants' benefit

Disclaimers:

Client must be open to:

- A. The real issues getting surfaced
- B. Solutions from any participant
- C. Trusting their participants to manage themselves, their participation and their own learning

How It Works:

Open Space events, while seemingly unstructured, require preparation, coordination and alignment. Pre-planning will include discussion of scope, communication, technology, reporting structure, room logistics, etc. Day-of facilitation will include context-setting, OS creation & supporting OS discussions/breakout sessions as needed.
